1 More Aircraft Parking

Enhanced facilities for families including new play space, sensory room for people with hidden disabilities, and gate lounge upgrades across the entire terminal including business hubs, new seating and other fixtures.

Expanding the check-in hall by approx 1,500 sqm to allow for additional check-in capacity and upgrading existing equipment.

6 Terminal Expansion

Expansion to the North by approx 10,000 sqm & South by 5,500 sqm. Delivering more aerobridges and gates for domestic and regional travellers.

7 New P2 Outdoor Carpark

Increasing the choices for carparking.

Overview

Project Flight is a program of infrastructure projects to upgrade Adelaide Airport's terminal and facilities for passengers worth \$600 million. This is our next significant capital works program following the new terminal build in 2005 and completion of the terminal expansion in 2021. Once finished, it will help the airport handle more travellers and will make their experience smoother and more comfortable. Our upgrades to the security infrastructure also ensures we are compliant with the latest aviation security requirements, keeping our airport and customers safe.

Key upgrades include:

- **Check-in Hall Expansion** – We're expanding the southern end of the check-in area by approximately 1,500 square metres, which is about the size of five tennis courts. This will boost check-in capacity by 25 per cent. All the old check-in equipment will be replaced with the latest technology. To make space, we're removing the southern ramp to Level 2 of the terminal. Demolition has already started.
- **Northern Terminal** – From early next year, we'll start expanding the northern end of the terminal by more than 10,000 square metres. This will include up to three new domestic gate lounges with aerobridges, and new office space for aviation-related businesses.
- **Southern Terminal** – Starting in early 2027, we'll also expand the southern end of the terminal by more than 5,500 square metres. This will include two new domestic gates and three new regional gates.
- **Aircraft Parking** – We're adding up to nine new aircraft parking bays at the northern and southern ends of the terminal giving us space to park more planes.
- **Security Screening** (in progress) – We're upgrading our security to meet new national regulations. This includes new body scanners and 3D x-ray scanners for carry-on bags. Six new lanes are now open. We're also upgrading the system that scans checked bags, with all new equipment due to be finished by the end of this year.
- **Gate Lounge Upgrades** – We're refreshing gate lounges across the terminal. Expect more comfortable seating, new business hubs, and other improvements to make waiting to board your flight even more enjoyable.

What will it deliver?

- **More rooms for planes:** Up to 9 new aircraft parking bays at both the northern and southern ends of the terminal, helping us to cater for more planes and meet airline scheduling needs.
- **Smarter, easier security screening:** Upgraded check-in baggage and passenger screening equipment to meet safety and regulatory standards.
- **A smoother check-in experience:** An expanded check-in hall with more counters, extra space, and improved equipment for a more relaxed start to your journey.
- **Extra space to grow internationally:** A new international gate lounge designed to support growing international flight numbers.
- **A more relaxed journey:** Upgraded international departures and arrivals areas, including refreshed lounge spaces and a dedicated family play area.
- **Growing the terminal, adding more boarding and arrival gates:** A terminal expansion to the north and south adding up to 5 new gates with aerobridges, helping us keep pace with increasing passenger numbers and peak travel demand.

Why are we upgrading?

To help Adelaide Airport prepare for the future, including more aircraft, more passengers, and better technology, we're focusing on:

- **Supporting growth:** Keeping pace with rising passenger numbers, with domestic travel already exceeding pre-COVID levels.
- **Enhancing the passenger experience:** Modernising facilities to ease pressure during peak times and make travel more enjoyable.
- **Streamlining operations:** Improving check-in, screening, and boarding with better systems and smarter processes.
- **Upholding safety standards:** Meeting national security requirements through advanced equipment and updated procedures.
- **Creating an inclusive space:** Ensuring the airport is accessible, welcoming, and easy to navigate for all travellers, including those with additional needs.

What are the benefits

- **Comfortable, efficient travel:** New, more comfortable spaces designed to simplify and improve the journey for everyone, including families, business passengers, and those needing extra support.
- **More space and better connections:** A larger terminal means less crowding and the ability to run more flights, making it easier to connect within Australia and overseas.
- **Smoother passenger flow:** Helping people move through the terminal more easily during busy times, with less waiting and crowding.
- **Next-gen security:** New technology that keeps passengers and their bags safe while meeting national safety standards.
- **Building for the future:** A flexible design that can grow with the airport and adapt as travelling patterns change over time.
- **Economic and tourism growth:** Expanding the airport to help grow South Australia's economy and attract more visitors.

What will happen during construction?

The work is being carried out in stages to help keep the terminal running smoothly.

At times, **temporary changes to procedures** may occur, such as changes to customers' travel paths.

In addition to make space for our terminal expansion, we're removing the southern ramp to Level 2 of the terminal. Demolition has already started. While some disturbance is unavoidable, all demolition activities will be closely monitored.

These changes will be clearly communicated and additional staff will be on hand to help and keep things moving.

You may notice construction activity around the terminal, including scaffolding, hoarding and equipment. Our customers are always at the front of our mind so wherever possible we will try to keep disruption to a minimum and will keep you informed about the changes that are happening along with what the upgrades will look like once finished.

Where works may impact **neighbours or the broader community**, we will give advance notice through several channels including Community Consultative Committees, letterbox updates as required, on our website and through social media.

We're committed to keeping customers, staff and the community informed throughout the works. We'll provide timely updates on any impacts and what we're doing to reduce disruption controls prior to and throughout the works.
