Adelaide Airport traffic recovers to 93% of pre-COVID volumes in Q3 FY23

The third quarter of the 2023 Financial Year saw almost 2 million passengers travel through Adelaide Airport, returning to 93% of pre-COVID volumes. Travel demand across all travel segments has remained strong, aided by increased international capacity and numerous Adelaide based events driving an increase in travel.

International traffic for the quarter of 195,000 passengers was significantly higher than the heavily COVID-impacted March quarter the prior year. Against pre-pandemic volumes, international passenger levels grew to 73% for the quarter due to Qatar Airways returning to daily services from late January, and additional seasonal frequencies from Singapore Airlines in the month of January.

Domestically, more than 1.7 million passengers travelled throughout the quarter, recovering to 96% of pre-COVID levels due to strength in leisure driven demand stemming from the numerous Adelaide based events including the Santos Tour Down Under, Fringe Festival, Adelaide Festival and WOMADelaide.
