Low Carbon Statement



At Adelaide Airport, our purpose is to proudly connect communities and help shape South Australia's future. We're living our vision to be "Everyone's favourite airport. Seamless. Connected. Easy."

We are the gateway to South Australia and the fifth busiest domestic and international airport in Australia. Adelaide Airport Limited has been the custodian of the long-term leases of Adelaide and Parafield Airports from the Commonwealth of Australia since May 1998. Adelaide Airport continues to be a globally connected transport hub with our property portfolio including purposefully planned industry clusters. Parafield Airport is South Australia's premier flight training aerodrome.

As we are now operating in a carbon-constrained world, we acknowledge the impact the aviation industry has on greenhouse gas emissions and the contribution from airport operations and our broader value chain.

We also recognise that climate change and carbon risk management are an essential aspect of operating a sustainable business over the long-term. We are therefore committed to employing principles of resource efficiency in our operations, planning and ongoing infrastructure development and in the procurement of goods and services. This approach will, in turn, help airlines and other tenants to reduce their impact.

Adelaide Airport Ltd is a member of Airports Council International and is committed to Airports Carbon Accreditation. Adelaide and Parafield Airports were the first two airports in Australia to achieve Level 1 Accreditation for carbon mapping. Further, we are committed to measuring and reducing our carbon footprint on an ongoing basis and encouraging partners, suppliers and other users of these airports to do likewise. In 2025 we achieved a 90 per cent scope 1 and 2 emissions reduction against our 2018 base year, as well as purchasing 'removals' offsets for our residual emissions. Our first purchase of offsets has been from a local land regeneration project¹ in the Gawler Ranges in South Australia.

We are committed to maintaining net zero in Scope 1 and 2 emissions and reducing absolute emissions beyond 90 per cent. We are committed to supporting the achievement of Net Zero in Scope 3 by 2050 or sooner from a 2018 baseline, aligned with sector frameworks and commitments, with interim targets outlined in a net zero roadmap.

We acknowledge that achieving Net Zero emissions is difficult for our sector due to key dependencies related to the availability of low-carbon jet fuel. However, we are committed to supporting and enabling progress in this area.
